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### There and Their

- **There** means at that place or to that place.  
Example:  
I eat in a restaurant. I always eat **there**!
- **There** may also be used at the start of a sentence.  
Example:  
**There** is someone in the house!
- **Their** always tells you who owns something.  
Example:  
I always visit my grandparents. **Their** house is big.

### Wear, Where and Were

- **Wear** means to have on the body, to put on.  
Example:  
When it's cold, I **wear** my coat
- **Where** means in what place or to what place or from what place.  
Example:  
**Where** do you live?  
**Where** are you going?  
**Where** do you come from?
- **Were** is the simple past of the verb “to be”.  
Example:  
Where **were** you yesterday? We **were** in a restaurant.

### Two, to and too

- **Two** means **2**  
Example:  
Two + two = 4

- **Too** means also or very or more than enough.  
Example:  
You are a student. I am a student, **too**.  
**Too** many people.  
The coffee is **too** hot.
- **To** is used to indicate that a verb is in the infinitive or is used as a preposition.  
Example:  
**To** be, **to** go, **to** play ...  
I go **to** school every morning.

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
